Tuesday Workshops

Five topics run over two sessions on Tuesday. A & B support Tuesday and Wednesday main sessions, C to E take three practical aspects of our work which need to remain healthy.

A: Our relationship with our Minister Jules Morgan

The workshop will pick up issues addressed in the two plenary sessions led by Jez and Jules earlier in the day with issues such as 'how to bring supportive challenge', 'how to ensure we don't undermine our Minister' and 'how to release our Ministers to be pastors and leaders'.

B: Busy Christian meets Backside Believer John Tindall

How can we stay healthy as Christian disciples when the work pressure is unrelenting? This workshop will look at Luke 10, both the Samaritan and the two sisters, and will seek to cover practical ideas for how we can be engaged in our 'work' without sacrificing our 'walk'.

C: Let's keep finance healthy Penny Clarke

How do we keep church finances healthy? Financial decision-making, transaction reporting, budget-making, budget tracking ... there are so many financial issues which can add stress to our ministry. This workshop seeks to address the above issues, identify good practice and understand how we can promote excellence and wellbeing.

D: Practical project planning Nici Johnson

Feeling overwhelmed by a project you are planning or have already started? This workshop aims to show that project success is about focusing on the people involved. It will give you practical steps for planning, organising and keeping control of projects big and small without having to rely on computerised tools.

E: Volunteers: heroes or villains Julian Mander

Why don't our volunteers do more than they do, and why are they such a pain to manage? Since when was church meant to be this hard when surely everyone should want to serve and use their gifts? In this workshop, discover what your volunteers are really thinking...

Jesus Christ as Lord

This is a professional conference designed to enhance our skills in key areas of our work. But we meet together as Christians of different denominations and traditions who want to follow Jesus Christ as Lord.

Our opening and closing sessions will include times of praise and prayer, we shall close with an informal Communion service, and we shall arrange informal times of intercession before breakfast each day.

John and Pauline Tindall (together or singly), our Chaplains, will be available throughout for confidential discussion, advice and prayer on anyone's personal discipleship, work relationships or family pressures. We hope you will make use of this special opportunity.

Speakers & Chaplains



Trevor Stammers has been Programme Director in Bioethics and Medical Law at St Mary's University since 2010. He is the editor of *The New Bioethics*, a writer and occasional broadcaster on bioethical issues.

Earlier, as a GP, he saw many Christian patients suffering from stress and depression and has written about his experiences in both medical and Christian journals. He was Chair of Christian Medical Fellowship during one of the most turbulent periods of its history, has experienced many pressures in church life and has also known God's help in coping with many family and personal pressures including a period of blindness.

He is married to Rachel and they have three adult children.

Jez Barnes was appointed Vicar at St Stephen's, Twickenham in 2009 and has been delighted to be able to continue the church's well-established pattern of church planting since then, with two planting teams going out in his time. Jez has played cricket for Oxford University - the height of his sporting career! He served as a curate at Holy Trinity Brompton for 5 years and was then Associate Vicar of an HTB plant.



Jez is married to Emma and they have three young children - Arthur, Kitty and Florence. Most time off revolves around family life, with the occasional game of friendly cricket still in the mix for Jez from time to time.



Jules Morgan has been Director of Operations and Development on Jez's senior staff leadership team since 2011. Prior to coming to this she was in senior scientific management, ultimately as a head of business support and training in a grant giving charity. Then God stepped in and she ended up in church administration!

Outside her paid St Stephen's role, Jules is also a diocesan clergy review consultant, a trained executive coach and probably her least favourite role - the cleaner for her husband's home office!
